
MISCELLANEOUS EVENTS


"Love on a Greyhound Bus" which Kay composed for the Van Johnson movie

No Leave, No Love (MGM, 1945)... plus Kay's jazz hot arrangement of Irving Berlin's


"How Deep Is the Ocean?" As if that weren't enough, Cortés graciously plugged


